The frequency of publication and format of the magazine was quite inconsistent from 1967 until 1975.

Numbering and dating of issues were at various points inconsistent. While most issues were published with both volume/issue numbers as well as dates, some were published with dates only and others were published with volume/issue numbers only. The numbering system, furthermore, was re-started in 1975 and again in 1986. For this reason, this index uses only dates to indicate in which issue a particular item appears.

In the case of four issues of *Pacific* that were published without dates, we have had to reconstruct those dates, as follows:

Vol. 3 no. 1 = Fall 1988
Vol. 15 no. 1 = Fall 2001
Vol. 15 no. 2 = Spring 2002
Vol. 15 no. 3 = Summer 2002

This index includes citations to most but not all items published in these magazines. Items that have been omitted include most marriage, birth, death, and other news items submitted by individual alumni, advertisements, announcements for upcoming regular events (such as Homecoming), and poems and devotional articles written by authors not affiliated with FPU. This last category of items most commonly appeared in the 1940s and 1950s.
